We are seeking graduate and professional students to join our panel on graduate student research. The conference will provide an inclusive and broadly defined forum that facilitates academic discussion while encompassing an abundant range of topics. In choosing this intentionally multi-disciplinary theme we would like to encourage discussion about **"Women's Leadership in International Graduate Research"**.

Topics of interest include but are not limited to:

- Colonialism
- Globalization
- Women in industry
- Health care
- Ageing
- Power, politics and decision-making
- Technology and innovation

We encourage applications from graduate students working in all disciplines with research that involves, supports, highlights or benefits the role of women's leadership and scholarship internationally. Submissions are welcome from current graduate students, as well as those who have completed their graduate studies within the last year. We seek to assemble a diverse group of scholars in order to foster interdisciplinary discussions, and priority in selection may be given to those who self-identify as women and/or as international students. Presenters will be allotted 10 minutes to deliver a summary of their research on a panel with several other students, followed by a discussion period where all students on the panel may be asked questions.
